A total of **169 PQs** were asked. The Ministry of Health received the most PQs.

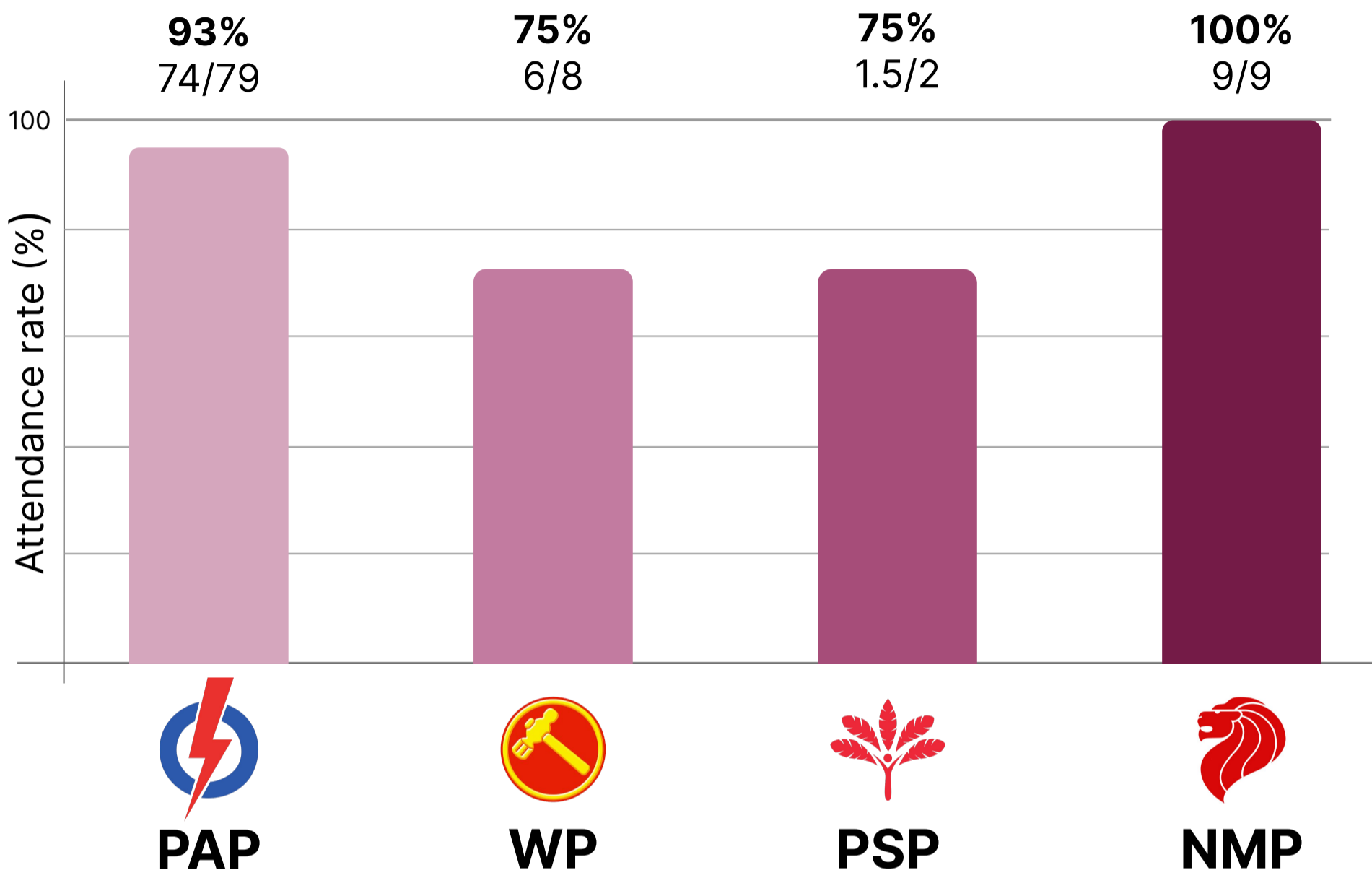
**11 MPs** debated a Bill to give the police more power to apprehend mentally ill suspects.

### Did you know?

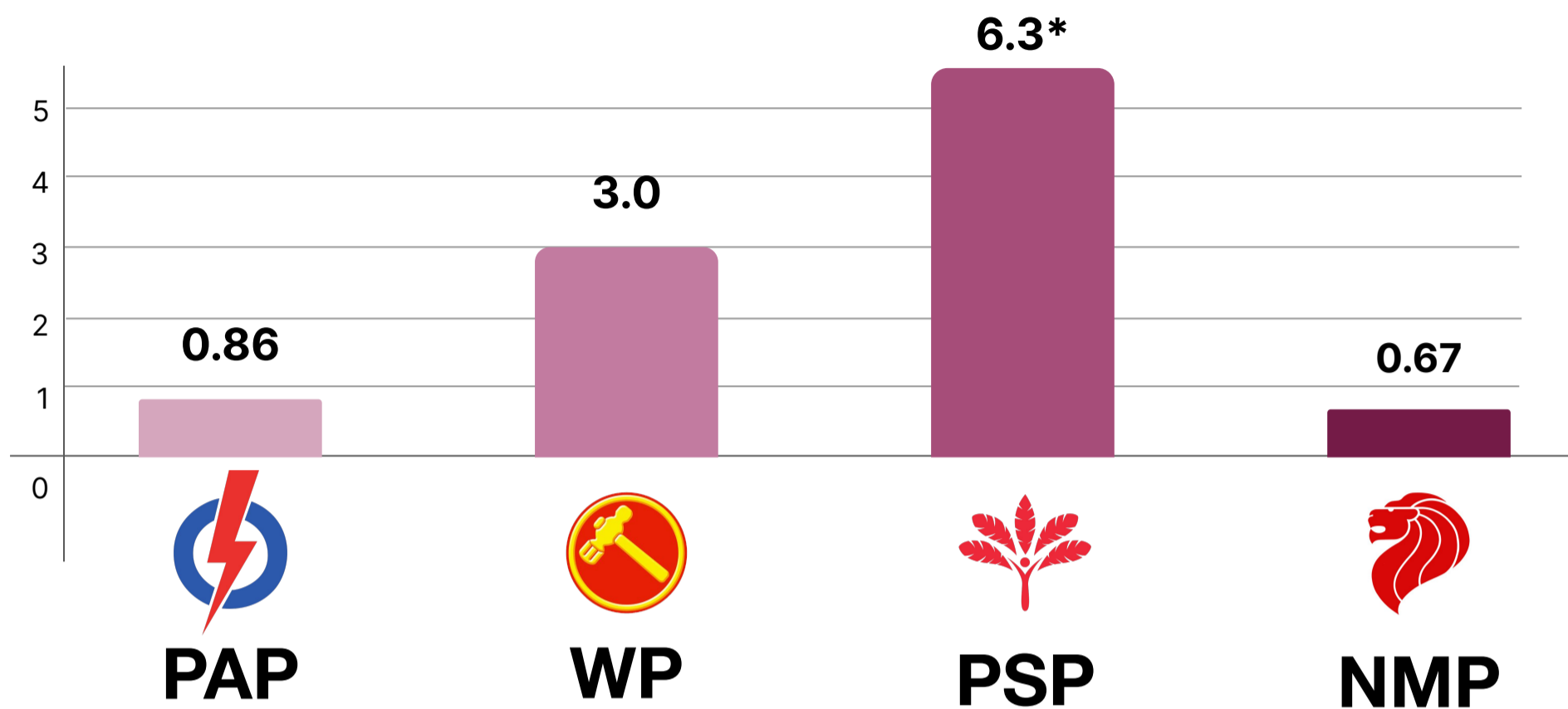
This charts average attendance across all sittings in the month based on the Parliamentary Reports, which track attendance at roll call.

Some photos or videos show that Parliament can be largely empty during less important debates.

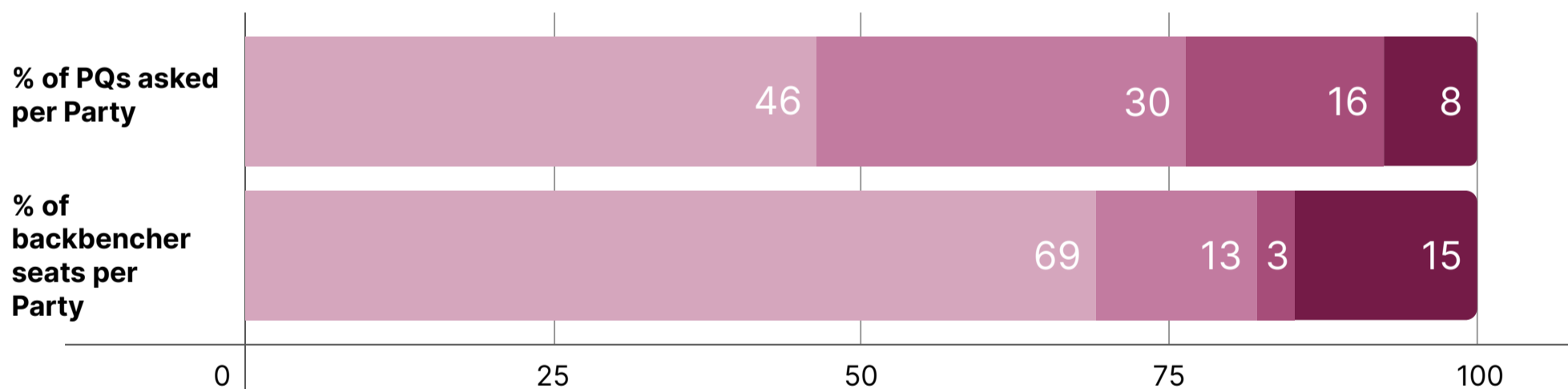

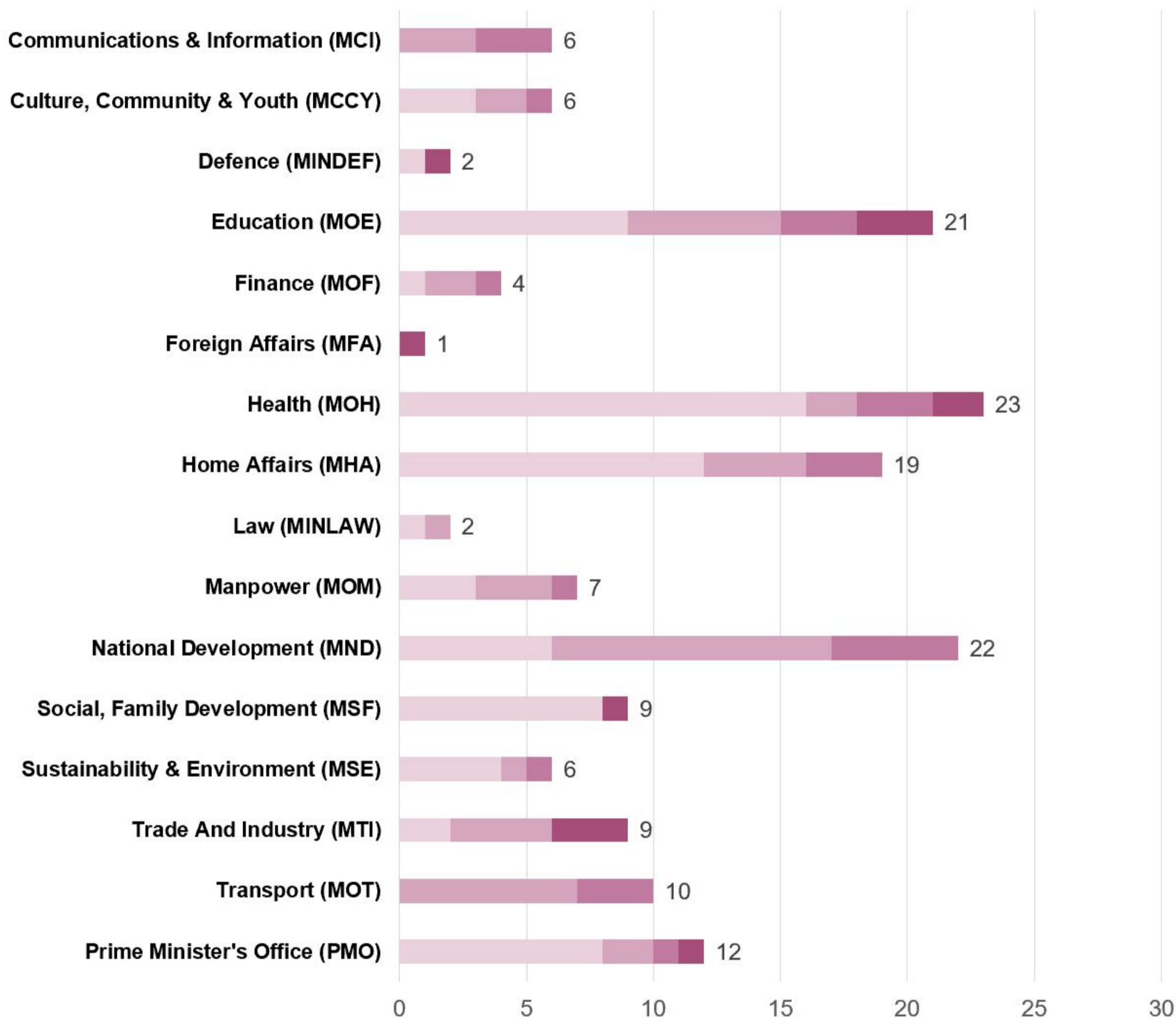

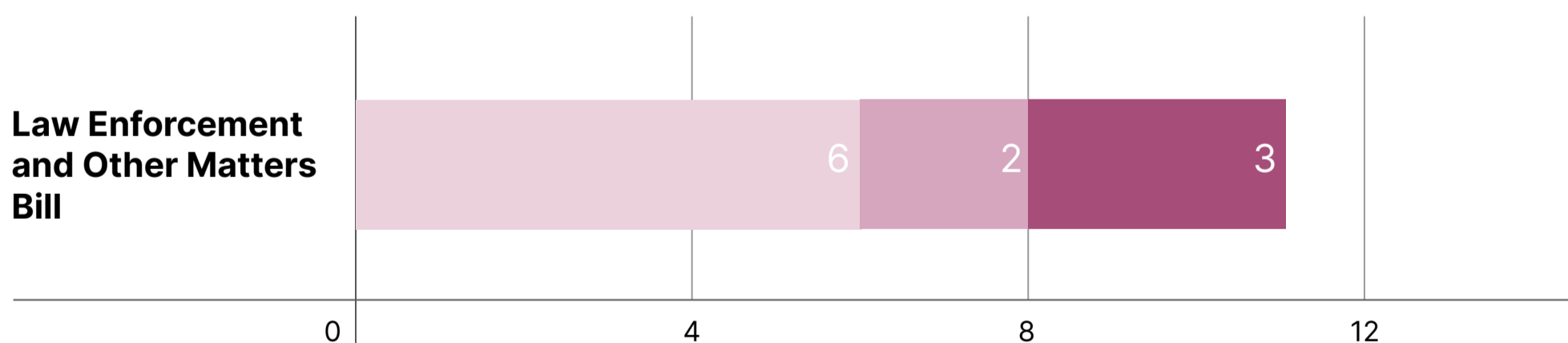
